～ *Let me tell you how things are going in Canada!* ②

共立女子中学高等学校はカナダ・ブリティッシュコロンビア州（バンクーバー地域）にあるメープルリッジ・ピットメドウズ教育委員会よりパートナー校として認定されており、カナダでの約10ヶ月の留学プログラムに、学内選考を経て高校1年生1名を毎年派遣しています。



ロングターム留学プログラム6期生である高校1年の [REDACTED] さんがカナダに出発して約半年が経ちました。[REDACTED] さんが通っているのは *West View Secondary School* というメープルリッジ・ピットメドウズ教育委員会学区域にあるハイスクールの1つです。今回のレポートでは学校生活やヴィクトリアへの遠足、カナダの冬について報告がありました。日本との違いをたくさん発見したようです。楽しんでお読みください！



◆ メイプルリッジ／ピットメドウズ教育委員会

カナダの西海岸、バンクーバー国際空港より約1時間の場所に位置します。公立の小・中・高等学校を管轄する教育委員会で、質の高い教育プログラムを準備しています。国際バカロレアプログラムだけでなく、スポーツや芸術面でのコースも多数提供されています。また、14歳で飛び級してカナダ国内のトップ大学5校に合格し、カナダ政府にギフテッド〔天才児〕と認定された日本人少年の大川翔くんを輩出した学区でもあります。この学区は自然に恵まれた地域ですが、バンクーバー都市圏の一部を形成しており、大都市の便利さも持ち合わせた環境です。

School

カナダの学校では、日本のように全員が机を一列に並べて同じ方向を向いて授業を受けるのではなく、机を数人で囲んだり、班の形になって授業を行ったりします。授業内容も、グループワークが中心のものもあれば、板書を使って進めるものもあり、日本と大きく変わらない部分も多いと感じました。一方で、日本よりも休みが多く、週5日すべて学校がある週の方が珍しい点は印象的です。また、先生方がとてもフランクで、先生と生徒というより友達のような距離感で接してくれます。日本の学校もこうなったらしいのにな、と思うことがよくあります。今月、フィールドトリップに参加する予定でしたが、雪の影響で中止になってしまいました。しかし、フィールドトリップに行くまでの流れが日本と大きく違っていて面白かったので、ここで紹介したいと思います。フィールドトリップは申込制で、自分が行きたい内容を選んでフォームを提出し、費用を支払って初めて参加できる仕組みになっています。日本のように学年全員で同じ行動をすることは少なく、それぞれが自分のペースで動いているため、同じ学年でも全く違うスケジュールで過ごしているのが新鮮でした。



Trip to Victoria

11月末に、友人と一緒に Victoriaへのトリップに参加しました。メープルリッジでは留学生向けのトリップが数多く用意されており、その中から私は Victoria トリップを選びました。Victoria は BC 州の州都で、バンクーバーアイランドに位置しています。



マスは家族と過ごす大事なイベントです。ハロウィンが過ぎれば街一色クリスマスマードでした。冬休みが始まると、私の家にもホストシスターたちが帰ってきたり、ホストマザーの家族も集まりました。クリスマスの午前中にはプレゼント開封会をしてからクリスマスマーケットを観て、夜ご飯をいただきました。クリスマスシーズンには、友人たちとバンクーバーで開催されているクリスマスマーケットにも行きました。ホストマザーによると、BC州にあるクリスマスマーケットの中でも特にドイツの雰囲気に近く、本場に近いそうです。出店の中には実際にドイツ人が経営しているお店が多く、ドイツ人の友人は久しぶりに同郷の人と交流できて、とても嬉しそうでした。

日本ではすぐにクリスマスの飾りを下げるお正月の準備をするところ、片付ける気配もなく、クリスマスの装飾を出したまま年を越しました。お正月にはおせちを食べたり、お年玉をもらったりと日本の年末年始は忙しくも楽しいこと続きですが、カナダの年末年始はクリスマスが過ぎればゆったり過ごしてました。

Kia ola!! It has already been 6 days since I came here and I'm getting used to the living in New Zealand. First 2 days, my host grandmother took me to a lot of places like Maui park and to the pool in upper hutt. It was a lot of fun. I also went for a walk and I'm really surprised to see more nature than Japan here. The buildings in the lower hutt is not as high as the buildings in Tokyo and it really quiet too. My school is still not completely starting yet and I only went there for the orientation, but I'm already feeling excited to make new friends! Since my host father is a chef, the meals are all




very delicious and everyone is very kind to me. I played with my cute three host sisters and brother every day. Though I was a little bit scared in the first place, I'm relaxed now because I found out that this host family had 5 students before me! I'm really excited to experience more new things here in 2 months and can't wait to explore the culture differences too!

On January 25th, I left Narita Airport. Moving around the airports and passing immigration by ourselves was easier than I expected. At Wellington Airport, I met the ISA coordinator, and after a short rest, I took another flight and arrived safely in Lower Hutt. My host father came to pick me up, so I greeted him for the first time and went to the house. Then I finally met my host family. It was my first time speaking English seriously after leaving Japan, so I felt very nervous because I could not understand everything they said. But after about five days, I started to understand more.



The house is very big, and I was surprised. I also have a host sister and a host brother who are three years younger than me, and spending time with them feels new and fun. During the first two days, I was tired because of the new schedule and environment, but after sleeping well and trying many things, I got used to it by the third day. Here is what I usually do on days without school:

Morning: I make my own toast or eat cereal. Then my host sisters ask me, "Do you want to play on the trampoline?" and we jump together.

Afternoon to Evening: I eat lunch, pick blackberries in the backyard with the sisters, and eat them. We also play with the neighbor's kids or my sisters' friends. After that, I help with housework, eat dinner, take a shower, and study English in my room.

The first day of school was only an orientation, so it went well. After that, I went to a big mall near the school. I did some window shopping and ate sushi for lunch, which was very good. When I tried to take the bus home, the system was difficult and I got lost, so I walked for 40 minutes, but I still made it home safely.



I learned that I can actually do well even in a new environment, and that made me feel more confident. There are still times when I don't understand English, but every day is really fun. I enjoy it so much that I want to stay for a year, not only ten weeks. My host family and even the neighbors are interested in Japan, and that makes me happy as a Japanese person. I like people in New Zealand because they say hello when we pass each other on walks and they try to talk with me. Also, many people walk barefoot and the sunset is late, so everything feels new and exciting. School starts next week, so I want to do my best in everything. See you!

Everyone looks similar to me, and I find it hard to remember faces and names. Some students I thought were older than me were actually younger, and everyone looks very mature.

I had heard that people go to bed early, but dinner sometimes finishes around 8 p.m., so I end up going to bed late. My host mother asked me to make one dish, so I cooked Japanese curry and rice. She said it was delicious, and I was very happy.

There have been some problems, but I will keep doing my best.

Starting next week, school will be truly beginning, so I want to actively talk to people to make new friends.






探究学習のような英語以外の学びもある


これから海外研修に参加するとしたら、どこの国に行きたいですか。


海外研修の参加した場合、寮、ホームステイ、ホテル滞在どちらに魅力を感じますか。


1. 本校の夏季海外研修と春季海外研修の制度について、どの程度ご存知ですか？

2. お子様を海外研修に参加させたいと思いますか？



2.の質問で、「是非参加させたい」、「条件が合えばどのようなプログラムに参加させたいですか？」






